The Gospel reading today —is the parable of the fig tree. Jesus told a story about a farmer who came every year to look for figs on the tree, but there weren't any. So the farmer told the gardener to cut the tree down. But the gardener asked the farmer to give it another chance for another year. During that year the gardener would take special care of the tree so that maybe it would produce fruit for the farmer next year.

Jesus was really talking about us - and about God. God wants us to do good things - he expects it of us. When we don't do good things he is very disappointed - sometimes he is angry - but like parents, when we

get things all wrong, He is willing to give us another chance. Jesus says that He will take care of us - that He will help us to grow and bear fruit.

For that to happen we need to believe in Him which is like the sun to us, and to study His word which is like the water we need, and pray to Him

- which is like the fertilizer that we need to stay healthy.
